Who We Are

Reentry Care provides a healthcare safety net for people returning from incarceration. As a licensed health insurance agency, we partner with jails, prisons, probation, parole, and nonprofits to ensure every person released gets free healthcare enrollment assistance.

How Justice-Impacted People Use Our Service

1. Complete [this short request form](#) to get started and one of our licensed healthcare specialists will contact the individual shortly.
2. Once we are in contact with the individual, we verify their information, review all their options with them, and help them choose a plan that's best fit for their needs.
3. After enrollment, we ensure documents and ID cards are received, and that the individual knows how to access their prescriptions, primary care, and mental health services right away. This support prevents gaps in care, improves health outcomes, and boosts each person's confidence and stability.

We currently offer returning citizens free healthcare enrollment assistance in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kansas, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.
